

Pittsburgh ready to rock

Pittsburgh is going to rock this summer — especially Civic Arena and Three Rivers Stadium.

Pat DiCesare Productions has a super lineup of attractions at those sites. The action begins June 23 at 7 p.m. with Pittsburgh's first Rock Spectacular at Three Rivers Stadium and rolls on through Aug. 29.

Headlining the June 23 Stadium extravaganza will be Alice Cooper, which has drawn sellout crowds at the Arena in the past.

The unpredictable Cooper show, an unprecedented event in Pittsburgh, also will include Humble Pie and Uriah Heep. All three groups have top-selling

While the Alice Cooper-Humble Pie feature is sure to pack the Stadium (it seats nearly 50,000), the Rolling Stones are causing tongues to wag among rock buffs of all ages in this neck of the woods.

According to the Stones' public relations people, "The tour contains innovations in booking, consumer protection, security and staging never before used for rock concerts. To prevent scalping of tickets, there has been an 'absolute' limit of four tickets sold per customer. In each city, all outlets are to put tickets on sale simultaneously 30 days prior to the playdate. Newspaper ads will carry details."

The public relations folks continued:

"The innovations in production and staging eliminate most sound and lighting equipment from the stage, thereby enabling the audience to have an unobstructed view. Towers will hold sound equipment, except the group's amplifiers, above the sightlines of the viewers and a system of blacklighting utiliz-

ing mirrors, making the stage brighter than otherwise possible."

The Stones' 1972 tour of the United States and Canada will cover 30 cities. It opens June 3 and concludes in New York, just two days after their Civic Arena appearance.

Appearing on the bill with the Stones will be Stevie Wonder and Martha Reeves and the Vandellas. Which makes the announced top ticket price of \$6.50 one of the biggest bargains rock fans will ever get in this area.

Grant, baroness receive settlement
